

MISSION STATEMENT

The corporation is organized and operated by professional, educated African-American men who volunteer to improve the quality of life of people in the greater Pittsburgh community.

IOTA PHI FOUNDATION ACTION PROGRAMS

Scholarship – Since 1984, over 175 young African-American men and women have received scholarships totaling more than \$345,000 to further their education. These scholarships are merit based and recipients receive an award placque and \$2,000 to attend a college or university of their choice.

Thanksgiving Food Baskets – Every year the program provides over 400+ food baskets, with all the trimmings, so needy families may have a Thanksgiving meal. Since its inception, more than 6,000 needy families have received a Thanksgiving basket.

Christmas with Santa Claus – For more than 25+ years, a Christmas Celebration Party is held at the Fraternity Center. The program provides toys, treats, books, and photos with Santa to hundreds of children. Santa's helpers read stories to the children to help them learn about the true meaning of the holiday season. Overall, more than 7,000 kids have participated in this charitable program.

Achievement Awards - The program recognizes Pittsburgh area leaders in business, education, medicine, community advocacy, Citizen of Year and an Omega Man who has most demonstrated the principles of Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance

and Uplift during the year. In the past 15 years, more than 125 individuals have been recognized for making a difference in the community.

Historical Black College and University Tour – Since its inception, more than 2,500 high school juniors from the Pittsburgh area have visited 14 HBCU's annually, including Tennessee State, Fisk, Tuskegee, Norfolk State, Hampton, Virginia State, Howard, Spelman, Claflin, Morehouse and South Carolina State. Approximately 44% of the students who go on the tour actually enroll at a HBCU. During the tour the students visited several historical landmarks including the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute, the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church (site of the 1963 bombing that killed 4 young girls), George Washington Carver Museum, the Martin Luther King Visitor's Center and the Blacks-in-Wax Museum in Baltimore.

Annual Ron Foster Memorial Golf Tournament – The tournament was established in 1996 to raise funds for the Iota Phi Foundation Scholarship Fund. The Scholarship fund supports the educational aspirations of deserving high school students. All proceeds benefit the Iota Phi Foundation Scholarship Fund.

PROGRAMS IN COLLABORATION WITH IOTA PHI

The lota Phi Foundation collaborates with Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, lota Phi Chapter, in all of its community initiatives. Additionally, opportunities are presented to synergize with other noteworthy organizations to better serve and meet the needs of Pittsburgh's multicultural communities

Financial Literacy – The Pittsburgh alumnae chapters of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc. and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. teamed up in 2017 to provide free financial literacy workshops for the community at large. To date we've created, organized, led, and facilitated eight workshops throughout 2017, 2018 and 2019. Some of the topics within these workshops have included: Goal Planning, Budgeting and Savings, Investing, Retirement and Insurance, Home Ownership (Mortgage), Wellness Fair, Finance and Financial Aid for High School Seniors and Parents/Caretakers, Finance 101 for youths, Debt Management, Credit Repair/Recovery and Careers in Finance. Approximately 500+persons have participated.

So Fresh, Clean and Crispy Tour – Provided free haircuts to over 100+ students from grades Kindergarten to 12th grade from all over the county. It also included free academic and legal advice for survival, books, backpacks, school supplies, tooth brushes, toothpaste, food and instructions regarding how to participate in the HBCU Tour and Scholarships. Please note this event is part of our "Assault On Illiteracy and our Fatherhood social action programs.

Dr. Carter G. Woodson Academy – The Academy is held in honor of the work, life and ideas of our fraternity brother and the founder of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASSAALH), Dr. Carter G. Woodson. The Academy meets on Saturdays each year between February and April. Rooting its approach in African American culture and being intentional about preparing African American youth to serve in the African American community, the Academy teaches Art, History, Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) to African American youth in K-12.

Community Day – Each year members of the various African American fraternities and sororities come

together to provide recreation and health promotion activities to residents of the East Liberty, Larimer, and Homewood communities. This event has been traditionally held at the lota Phi Foundation and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Community Center.

Center for Victims Partnership – lota Phi Foundation and lota Phi Chapter partnered with Center for Victims to speak out about violence against women. This unique collaboration was critical in expanding Center for Victims "Men's Challenge" initiative. The Men's Challenge initiative is an ongoing campaign, pledge and action plan to engage men to make a commitment to learn more about violence against women and girls. In March of 2018, approximately 25 Members of Omega Psi Phi, lota Phi Chapter recorded a 60 second public service announcement that aired in April of 2018 speaking out against Domestic Violence.

The major source of funding for the Scholarship and Social Action Programs are individual contributions from members of the fraternity and foundation, corporate donations, fraternity dues and special events such as the Mardi Gras, Boat Ride, and BowTies & Sundresses. These fundraising activities help maintain the business of the Foundation and the Fraternity to achieve their Mission and bring their Vision to fruition.

Lastly, these venues are excellent opportunities for exposure for organizations that are committed to the community in general and the African American community in particular.

It is important to note that active members of the Foundation and Fraternity represent a broad cross section of the African American community...it includes, lawyers, judges, teachers, business executives, bus drivers, social service providers, health care workers, college professors, business owners, and craftsmen, etc.



ERIC ANDERSON

Eric Anderson is a tenured professor in the School of Design at Carnegie Mellon University (CMU) where for 20 years he has taught design thinking and strategy, user-centered design methods, and experience design within the context of product design and product visualization studios at the undergraduate and graduate levels. He is a co-founder of the Integrated Innovation Institute and until recently was an instructor and co-director of its Master of Integrated Innovation for Products and Services that brought together design, engineering, and business students to learn product and service innovation. He has now returned to his teaching and research in the School of Design, and a focus on his new role as a Senior Associate Dean for the College of Fine Arts.

Prior to teaching at CMU, Professor Anderson spent over a decade as a full-time design practitioner for corporate departments and consulting firms based in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, where he designed a broad variety of product solutions in medical instrumentation, tradeshow exhibition, corporate identity, and consumer product spaces. Professor Anderson is a Past President of the Industrial Designers Society of America (IDSA), where he was credited for leading the successful effort to "save the society". He is a member of the prestigious IDSA Academy of Fellows and a past member of the Board of Trustees for The Design Foundation. He holds a BS in Industrial Design from the University of the Arts, and an MA and MFA in Design Education from The Ohio State University.

In the fall of 2018, the Department of Design at The Ohio State University celebrated its 50th anniversary where Professor Anderson was honored as one of 15 Distinguished Alumni from its illustrious history.

He has served in numerous leadership positions on professional, academic, and community boards, and for the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., which he became a member in 1987.

DONNA JACKSON LARIMER CONSENSUS GROUP

Donna Jackson is a retired Telecommunications Officer for the City of Pittsburgh. She has a passion for community engagement and revitalization, and is a strong proponent of quality affordable housing, equitable provision of public and community services, quality education for all, and a fair distribution of economic opportunities across the city. With a vision for change in the Larimer neighborhood, Donna was instrumental in engaging the community around green sustainable development. Donna contributed to the creation of five action teams targeting – vacant lot care, the health and well being of the neighborhood, beautification of green spaces, celebration of successes, and communication. She also helped advance the formalization of the Larimer Vision Plan that serves as the foundation and guiding document for community change.

As Board Chair of the Larimer Consensus Group (LCG), Donna has helped the organization provide a strong voice for residents in decisions about development in the Larimer community, and led an award-winning process of comprehensive community planning. LCG also significantly contributed to Larimer's award of a highly competitive \$30 million Choice Neighborhood grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to implement a comprehensive revitalization strategy for the community.

EMERGING LEADER AWARD



BRIAN BURLEY

Brian Burley is a bestselling author of YNGBLKPGH, speaker, and entrepreneur. As the founder of YNGBLKPGH, Burley helped create a community of over 4,000 black millennials across the region and country focused on giving back to the next generation.

In 2019, Burley delivered his first talks for TedX and graduated from Leadership Pittsburgh's Leadership Development Initiative (XXVI). He also became the Director of Economic Inclusion at The Allegheny Conference on Community Development where he is spearheading their efforts around equity and cultural inclusivity. Burley previously held roles in the financial services industry and in healthcare automation.

In 2017, Burley was a recipient of Pittsburgh Magazine's 40 Under 40 Award and the New Pittsburgh Courier's Man of Excellence. He also represented the first Pittsburgh region cohort at Harvard Business School's Young American Leaders Program.

Burley serves on the board of The Allegheny County MWDBE Advisory Committee and The University of Pittsburgh's Institute of Entrepreneurial Excellence.

Burley received his undergraduate degree from Morehead State University, where he was a member of the football team, and his MBA from the University of Pittsburgh.

LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



T. RASHAD BYRDSONG

Rashad Byrdsong is the founder and Chief Executive Officer of Community Empowerment Association (CEA), a unique, community-based organization. He has successfully grown CEA from annual revenues of \$5,000 to over \$2 million. As President and CEO of MA'AT Construction Group, Byrdsong has created enterprises as economic generators through employment, training and investment in targeted, distressed Black communities. CEA has hired over 500 employees, worked with over 20,000 youth and trained over 500 individuals through its Construction Industry Training Program. Byrdsong created a comprehensive Public Health Approach to Violence Reduction for Pittsburgh and Allegheny County. This approach has been presented throughout Allegheny County and calls for a paradigm shift that views violence as a preventable social disease. Byrdsong is a noted national and international speaker/presenter about the work of CEA, and recipient of numerous professional awards for his work and ongoing commitment to empowering the lives of African Americans. Byrdsong has co-authored four articles: "Afrocentric Intervention Paradigm: An Overview of Successful Application by a Grassroots Organization" (Journal of Human Behavior in the Social Environment, 2013); "Suggested Paradigm For Violence Reduction: A Community-based Public Health Approach" (Journal of Evidence-Based Social Work, 2015); "Historical Overview of Black Suffering in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA: Depth of Contemporary Social Work Challenges" (International Journal of Social Work, 2017); and "Drug Abuse Trend and Profile of Current Social Crisis" (HSOA Journal of Addiction & Addictive Disorders, 2019)

OMEGA MAN OF THE YEAR




RON COURSEY, JR.
